CONSTITUTION OF THE SOLDIER CREEK
COMMUNITY COUNCIL

ARTICLE I

(NAME OF ORGANIZATION)

This organization shall be known as the Soldier Creek Community Council, and established under the Constitution and Bylaws of the Rosebud Sioux Tribe. Article V (Community Organization).

ARTICLE II

OBJECT OF ORGANIZATION

The purpose of this organization is to hold regular meetings of the Community and special meetings whenever necessary for the consideration of matters of local interest.

ARTICLE III

MEMBERSHIP

The membership of the Soldier Creek Community shall consist of all persons who are members of the Rosebud Sioux Tribe affiliated with the Community.

ARTICLE IV

OFFICERS

- Sec. 1. There shall be a President, Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer and Sergeant-at-Arms, and such other officers as it may from time to time desire.
- Sec. 2. These Officers shall be elected annually by popular vote at a duly called meeting for that purpose. After posting notices in conspicuous places at least ten days proceeding the date of said meeting. To be held in the month of December unless postponed by the President.

ARTICLE V

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

- Sec. 1. The duty of the President is to preside over all meetings of the Community Council and carry out all orders of the Council. The President shall vote only in case of a tie.
- Sec. 2. The Vice-President shall assist the President when called upon to do so, and, in the absence of the President, he shall preside, when so presiding he shall have all the rights, privileges, duties, as well as the responsibilities of the President.

- Sec. 3. The Secretary shall keep a full report of all proceedings of each regular and special meetings of the Council and shall perform such other duties of like nature as the Council shall from time to time by resolution provide.
- Sec. 4. The Treasurer shall be the custodian of all monies which come under the jurisdiction or in control of the said council. The Treasurer shall pay out money in accordance with the orders and resolutions of the Council, and will be required to report the receipts and expenditures whenever called upon by the President or upon suggestion of a member at any meeting.
- Sec. 5. It will be the duty of the Sergeant-at-Arms to preserve order at all meetings and carry out all orders of the President or the Vice-President.

ARTICLE VI

MEETINGS OF COMMUNITY COUNCIL

- Sec. 1. Regular meetings of the Community Council shall be the first Wednesday of each month at 7:00 p.m.
- Sec. 2. Special meetings may be called upon the discretion of the President whenever necessary for the immediate consideration of the matter of local interest.
- Sec. 3. The meetings to be held at such places as the Community Council may by resolution provide.
- Sec. 4. A quorum shall consist of the presence of ¹⁵ members, including the President or Vice-President at all meetings, to transact any business for the Community.

ARTICLE VII

DUTIES OF THE COMMUNITY COUNCIL

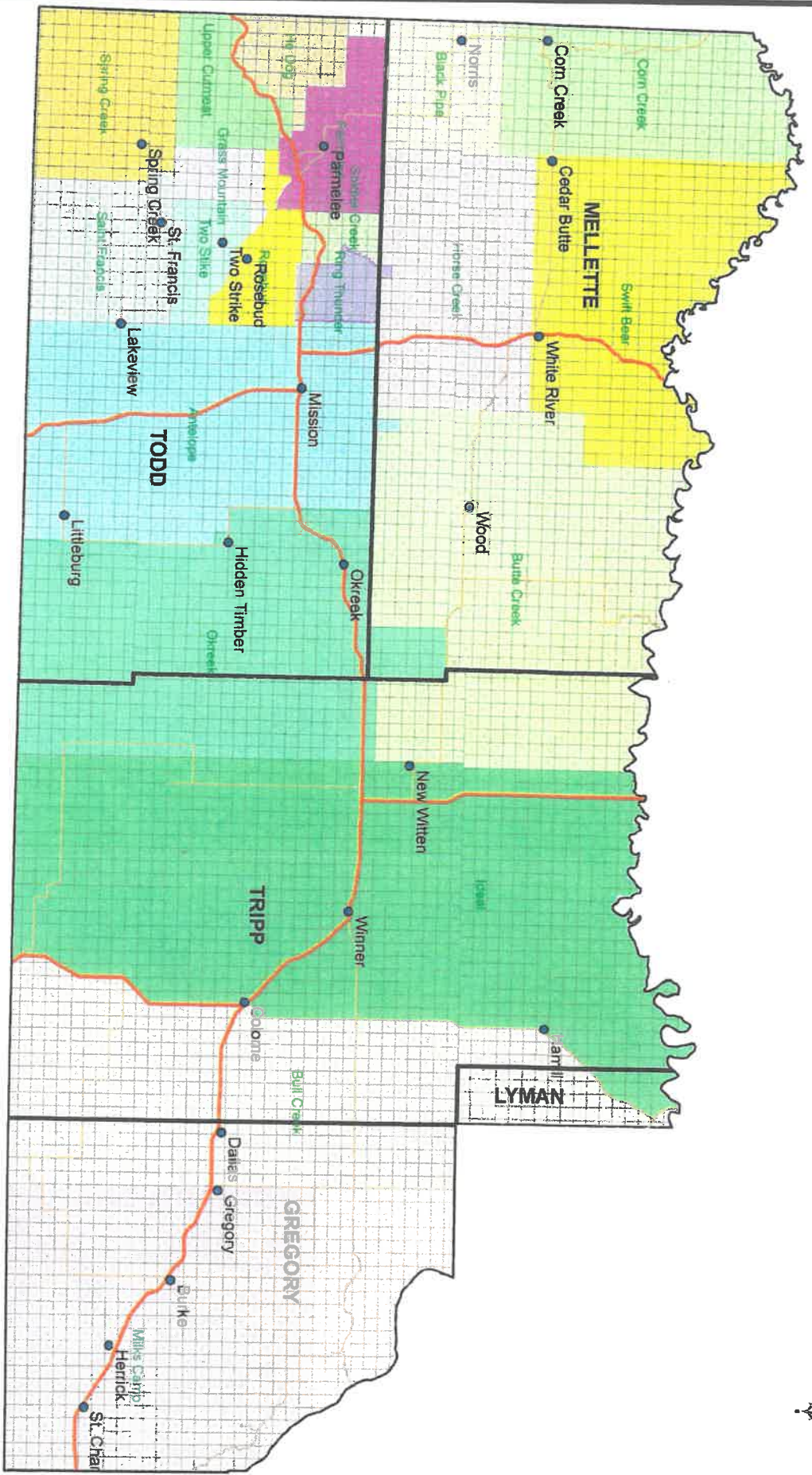
- Sec. 1. It may consult with representatives of the Interior Department on all matters of local interest and make recommendations thereon to the Tribal Council or the Superintendent or the Commissioner of Indian Affairs.
- Sec. 2. It may undertake and manage local enterprises for the benefit of the Community.
- Sec. 3. It may levy assessments upon members of the community.
- Sec. 4. It may expend moneys in the Community treasury for the benefit of the Community.
- Sec. 5. It may keep a roll of those members of the Tribe affiliated with the Community.

- Sec. 6. It may create committees for any or all of the department groups, such as health, education, welfare, law and order, etc., or create an executive committee as the Community Council may deem necessary.
Housing & water
- Sec. 7. It may exercise such further powers as may be delegated to the Community by the Tribal Council.
- Sec. 8. The actions of the Community Council shall not be inconsistent with the Constitution and Bylaws and Ordinances of the Tribe!

ARTICLE VIII

AMENDMENTS

Amendments to the Constitution and Bylaws may be amended by a majority vote of the members present at any meeting of the said organization.
